The shop, operated by Barbara Farquharson and Yvonne Hornby, sells clothing for men and women along with household items that can be made from Tie-Dye or Silk Screen materials. "As far as we know there is no other shop that sells these Ghanaian products," said Mrs. Hornby. "All products we sell are hand made whereas materials sold by other stores are made by machine." All fabrics sold in the shop are cotton milled in Ghana and the dye used is that of a cold water type. According to Mrs. Farquharson, the shop is not as busy as it could be. "The problem is, people come in to look at antiques and don't notice our display." People who do browse through, are impressed with the materials, said Mrs. Hornby. The two proprietors are planning to expand if business improves. "We'll definitely stay in Unionville," said Mrs. Farquharson. The shop is open Saturday, 10:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., and Sunday 1 p.m. to 5 p.m.
