Council agreed, however, with a Public Works Committee report that the roads should be plowed, out for the benefit of year-round residents and that adjustments to the plow blade, along with careful maneuvering would eliminate damage to private property.

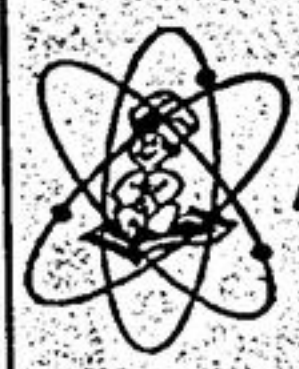
