Other positions, however, will be contested in an election, Dec. 4.

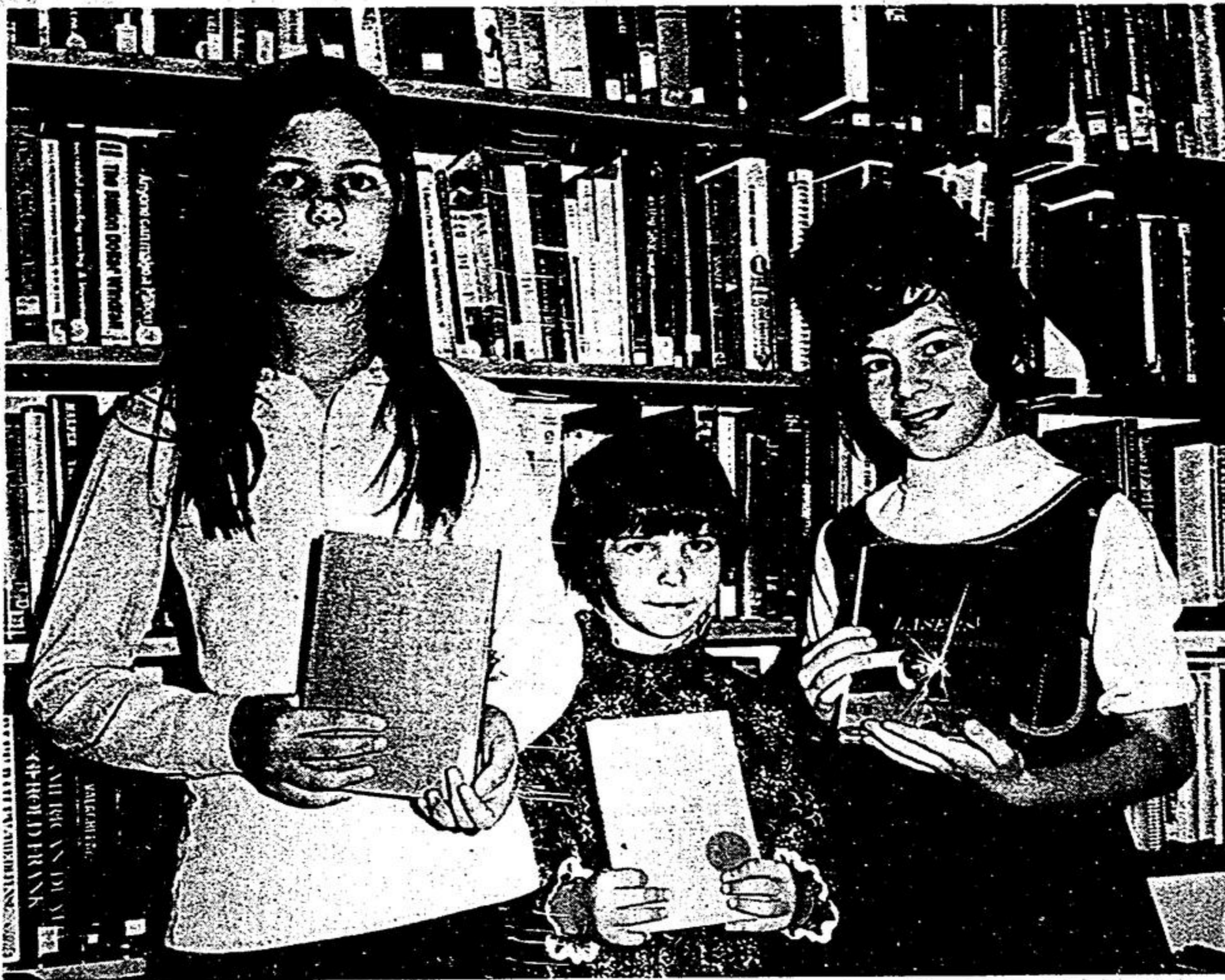
