 One thing that is clear is that it is not the Realtor or the owner. The final decision comes from the buyer and the influences on him are many.
 When a buyer is combing the market for a particular type of property in a given price range, for instance, there may be a surplus of that type of residence, many of them new which a builder is hard pressed to move. This could obviously affect what a buyer would pay for your house.
 An important part of the price is the value of the lot. Perhaps you have an expensive house in an inexpensive area. This fact could depress the value of your home in relation to similar ones in other areas where the lot price is high.
 If your architectural style is scarce and in demand, then that is a plus on the price.
 Quite often a particular buyer wants what your house alone has - a large backyard, lots of shade trees, a running brook or a quiet cul-de-sac lot - so your house will be worth more to him.
 Home marketing is a task for an experienced Realtor who knows his market and how your home fits into it. Ask his counsel.
