

Housewife seeks Markham Ward 6 post

MARKHAM - Lea Reid, housewife, at R.R.2, Markham, is running for Ward 6 councillor in the Dec. 4 election, Town of Markham.

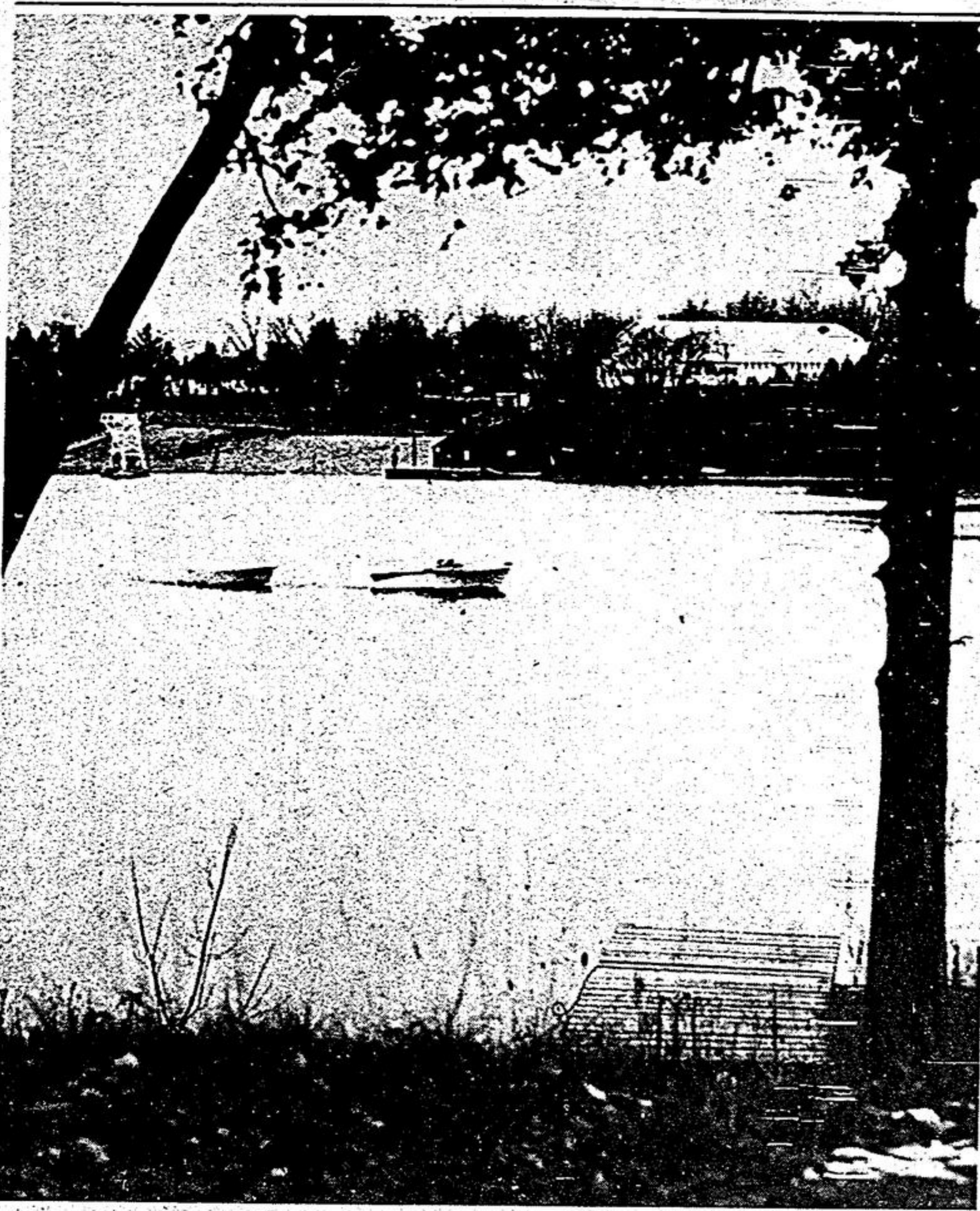
Mrs. Reid enters the race with previous experience as Secretary - Treasurer of the Ward 6 ratepayers' association and 12 years with Bell Canada's engineering department in a supervisory capacity.

The development of Markham is at the top of her list of priorities. "Markham is a fast-developing Town and I want to keep a balance between urban and rural build-up", she said. People who move into the Markham area are concerned with maintaining a rural atmosphere.

With regard to commercial development, Mrs. Reid said Markham does not have adequate services to handle new industry. Water is limited and residents in the 19th Avenue area are using well-water. "I don't think Markham is planning far enough ahead".

"A councillor has the duty of representing the people and to perform this obligation properly", she said. "He or she should inform the Ward about what issues are coming up at council meetings". "A councillor should ask the people in what way he is to put forth their feelings on specific issues", she added.

When asked about regionalization, she commented, "The basic philosophy is good, but people seem to be getting further away from what is going on in the region. Regionalization was incorporated to cut costs, but in the area of busing school children, the costs have gone

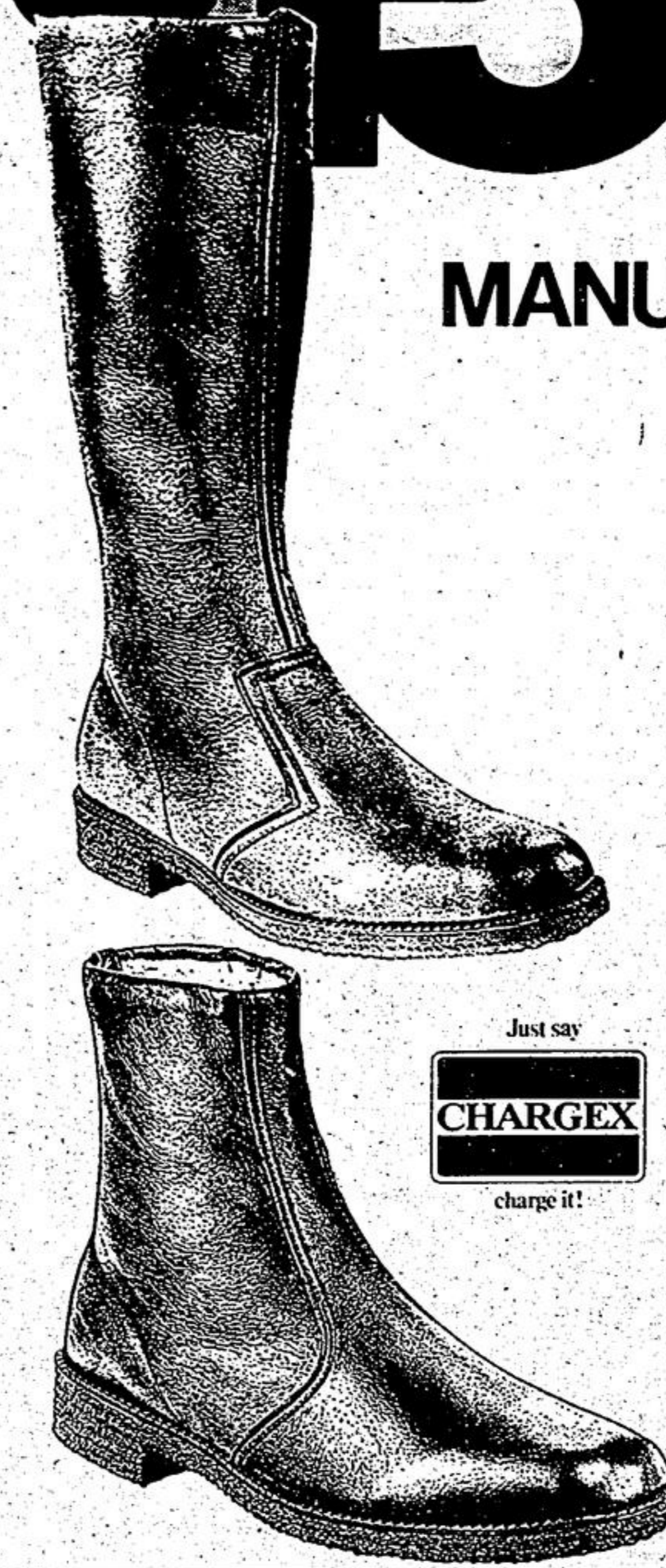

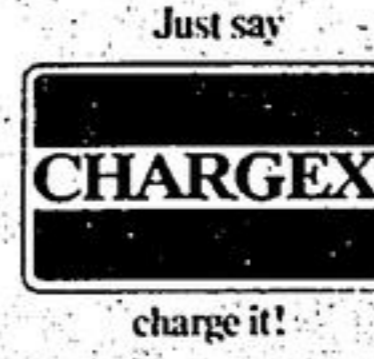
