

GOODWOOD - At the all candidates meeting held at the new Goodwood Community Centre Nov. 23, five. candidates for trusteeship on the Ontario County Board of Education defended their reasons for seeking election.

Yvonne Christie, part - time teacher for the Northumberland -Durham Board of Education, said she has handled many areas of school administration and considers herself a guidance, specialist.

'As schools increase identity in size, problems become more severe among children," she said. "Students don't know where they're going."

In a criticism toward the present board, she said, "I feel the board is building larger schools for the purpose of closing down smaller schools, and I don't think a 35 - mile bus trip is necessary for five - year - old children."




