Ross Deakin is a lifelong resident of Pickering, and has

seen the system of education grow from the one-room school that he attended on Brock Road, to the size we know it today.

Mr. Deakin puts forward the following reason for letting his name stand again: "I have a very real concern for our boundaries and tax base with the probable advent of Regional Government in 1973. I am vitally interested as your representative and, as a parent of 3 school children, in the Board's continuing program of improving educational standards, to equalize learning opportunities and facilities for students, regardless of the geographic location within the County. This was one of the main reasons the Government formed County Boards throughout the Province. I am interested and have been promoting more extensive community use of school facilities."

"I will keep the people of Ward 1 informed of County Board proceedings through the local press."

"I am sure, with Regional Government in the near future and the possibility of a new town in Ward 1 along with continued educational improvement in the area, it will require an experienced representative. I have that experience."
