Public use of schools is urged by candidate

PICKERING TWP. - While there is no municipal election in Pickering Twp., Dec. 4, ratepayers will go to the polls to select trustees to the Ontario County Board of Education.

In Pickering Ward 1, there are two candidates in the field. Seeking re-election is Ross Deakin. Mr. Deakin's lone opponent is Kenneth C. Brown, Sideline 24, north of conc. 7.

Kenneth Brown, 30, and father of two, is a graduate from the University of Guelph, holding a BSc. degree. At present, he holds the position of Horticulturist with the new Metro Toronto Zoo.

With respect to the field of education in Ontario County, Kenneth Brown offers the following platform:

"I am extremely concerned that the present deadlock between the teachers and the board has deprived high school students in the county of the complete education that the extra-curricular activities produce. Some fresh ideas should be injected into the present stalemate by electing new members to the school board.

I feel the large investment that the taxpayers have in school buildings should produce greater returns. This could easily be realized by a

much greater community use of the school's physical facilities.

I strongly hope that the uneven distribution of the education tax burden could be relieved. This should best be done by pressing the provincial government to fund education expenses from some form of taxation that is more equitable than the present system of municipal levies on real property.

Hopefully, voters will overcome the apathy exhibited by the 22 percent vote in Pickering's last election, since the members elected to school board control such a significant portion of the municipal tax dollar."
