"Business Game" sponsored by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Ontario, along with teams from 200 schools throughout the province. The "Game" involves the setting-up, financing and operation of a manufacturing company to compete with others in a simulated business

atmosphere. The Stouffville students have been formed into 3 groups or "companies" with pupils assuming managerial posts. They must make decisions on setting prices, allocating cash and estimating the production volume to be marketed. The program at school is being supervised by Eric

Engelbert Commercial Director. The decisions made by the high school "financiers" will be processed by the Institute of Chartered Accountants. After a number of elimination rounds, the final will be held in Toronto in spring, when one of the teams will win the laurels as the most astute managers.
