

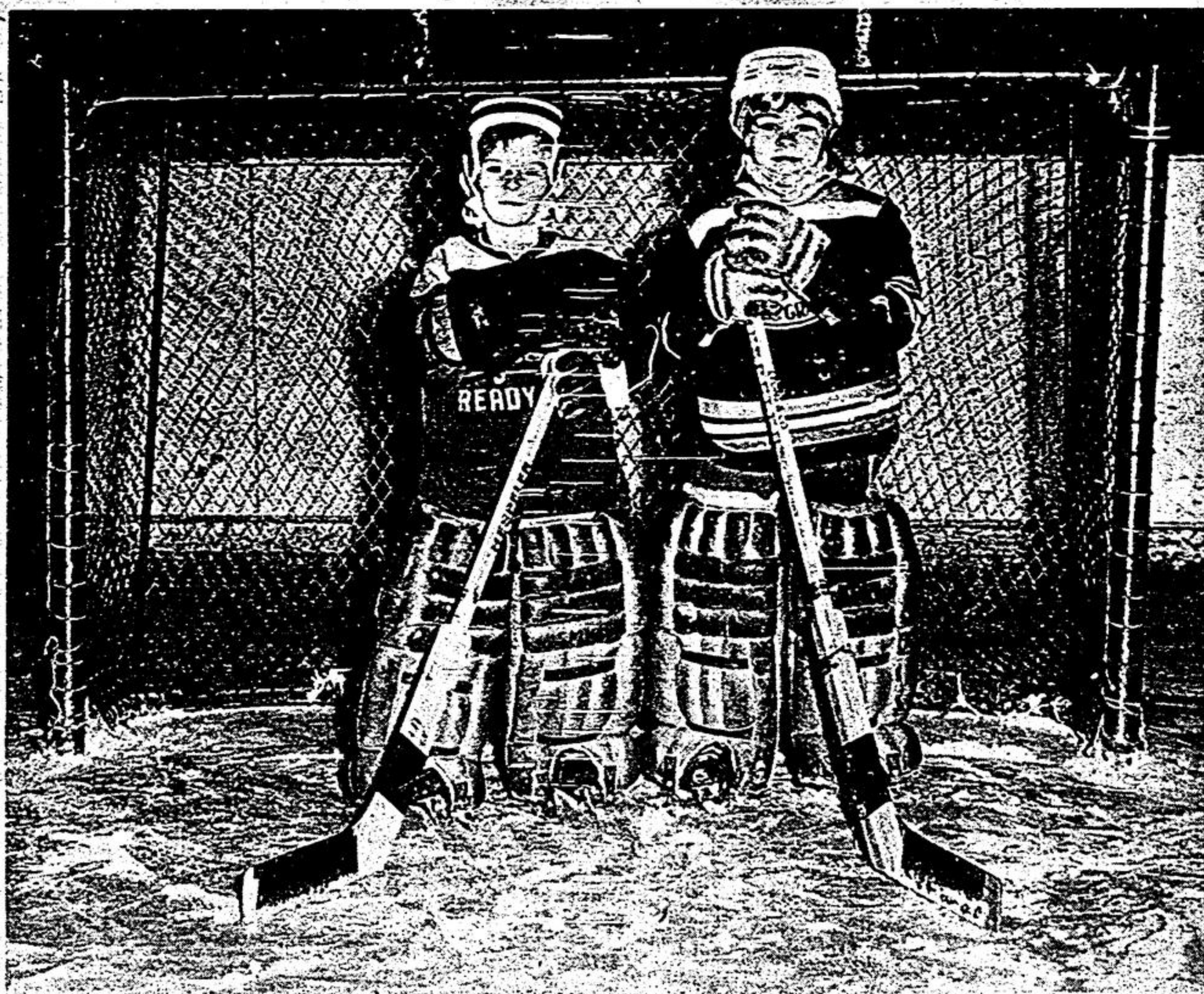
Hydro route study
