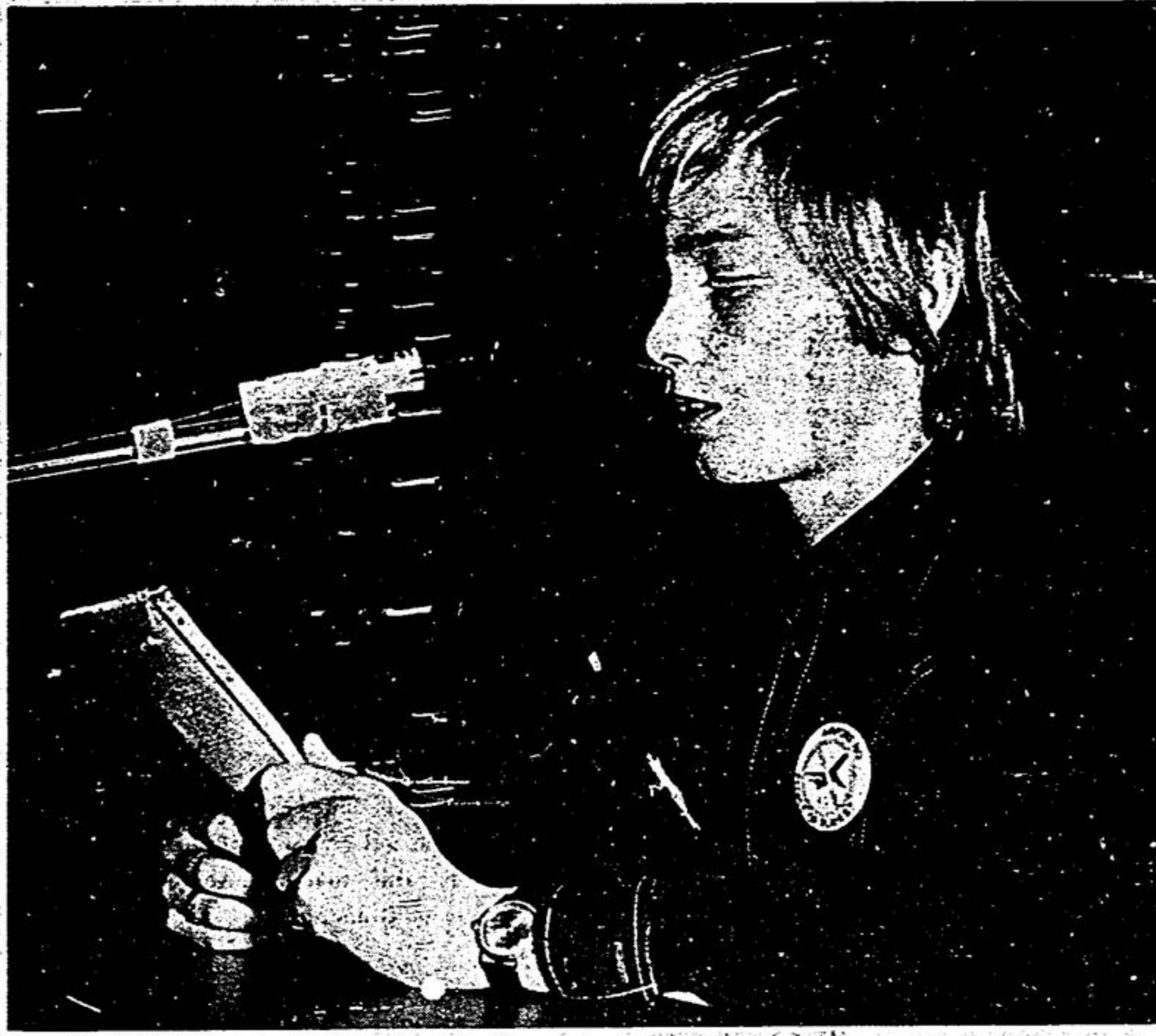

Review East End plans

STOUFFVILLE - Two revised plans for proposed residential development in Stouffville's east end - 5 lots on the east side of Cemetery Lane, and 97 lots on the north of Stouffer St. - were resubmitted to Planning Committee, Nov. 8.

The adjustment to the Cemetery Lane project, originally presented in July, showed a 60' diameter turning area at the end of the cul-de-sac.

Some members speculated that there would not be enough room for a snow plough to turn during clearing operations. However, consultation with the Road Superintendent confirmed it adequate.

The Committee voiced agreement with the plan as set out. The Suncrest subdivision on Stouffer St. showed a realignment of lots on its resubmitted plan.

Five percent of the area covered by a subdivision must be set aside, by the developer, for 'parkland' unless other arrangements are made with the municipality.

In this case, Planning Committee determined that there should be a minimum park provision, or more, but could not

decide on which section of the subdivision it should be located.

"We should take a drive up there and see for ourselves," suggested Councillor June Button.

Earlier she had advised members of a letter she received from a resident in the area who was concerned about the development's affect on traffic on Stouffer

Street and the drainage problems. She was assured that the builder would have to make definite commitments on 'services' in the Subdivision Agreement.

Members concurred that the developer was also committed to develop a park area and, on adjournment, headed for Stouffer Street to survey the Suncrest site.

Manager attacked in Becker robbery

UNIONVILLE - The Becker's Milk Store at 20 Fred Varley Dr., was robbed and its manager knocked unconscious early Monday morning.

According to York Regional Police, manager Robert Fell, 30, was out back of the store putting boxes in a garbage bin when someone struck him on the back of the head with what appeared to be a quart-size gin bottle. Mr. Fell, having a history of back trouble, dropped to the ground unconscious.

At about 1 a.m., still lying on the ground, he started shouting for help and shortly after

an attendant above the store reported the incident to police.

The suspect got into the store by the back door and stole three days cash receipts.

Mr. Fell was taken to Scarborough Centenary Hospital. The money stolen amounted to \$2,097.
