Hydro lineman honored

Saved fellow workman's life

Quick thinking action by an alert, young Scarboro Public Utilities apprentice lineman that averted a fatality in an electrical accident has been recognized with three awards to 21-year-old Brian Evans. Lineman Evans, of Martindale Road, Scarboro, saved the life of a fellow lineman with his knowledge of first aid by giving immediate mouth-to-mouth resuscitation to Howard Serson, 42, of 189 Lawson Road, following the electrical accident last August. Two outstanding safety awards have just been presented to lineman Evans. He received the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers'

safety award in a presentation recently by an IBEW representative, at a local 636 IBEW meeting, in East York. The second major award was the Electrical Utilities Safety, Association's certificate for "meritorious action" that was just presented by Harry G. Flack, manager of E.U.S.A. At that same time, Chairman Dick Cavanagh, of Scarboro Public Utilities Commission, presented lineman Evans with a handsome engraved wrist watch from Scarboro PUC. The electrical accident occurred near the intersection of McCowan Road and Sheppard Avenue when two line crews

were installing three 28,000 volt underground cables and associated hardware on a pole. The hydraulic boom of the hydro bucket truck came into contact with an 8,000 volt line. It energized the truck just at the time lineman Howard Serson was entering the cab and had grasped the door handle. He received severe shock and burns to his hands, arms, legs and back.

The electrical impulse hurled Serson against the vehicle and he fell to the ground unconscious when fellow workers cut the power contact. Brian Evans who was standing nearby jumped to Serson's aid immediately giving mouth-to-mouth resuscitation until there were signs of life. The injured man was rushed to hospital and recovered there after intensive care and therapy.
