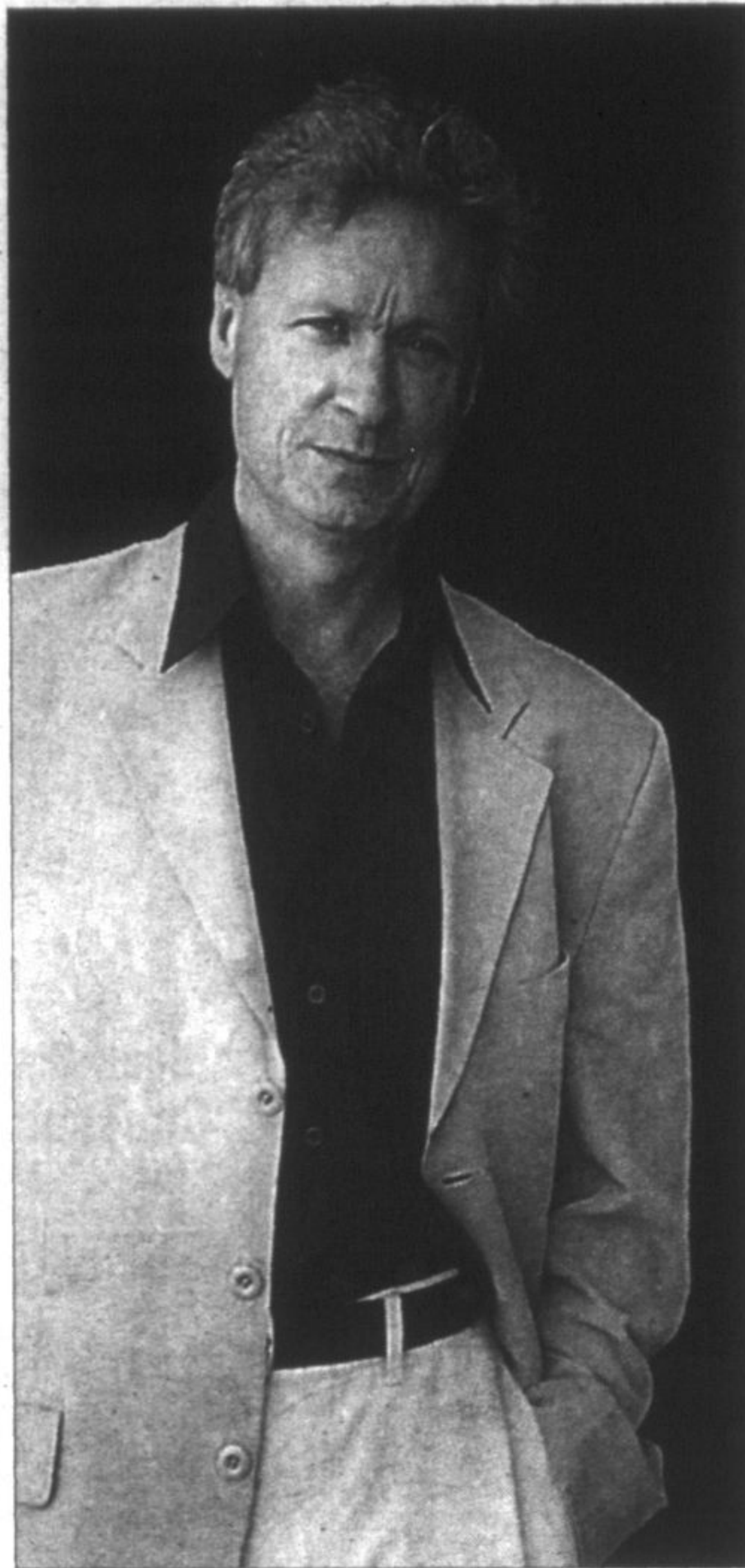

Trudeau re-visited during library talk

The Toronto Star called Stouffville's Bruce Powe "one of our finest cultural commentators".

Stouffville resident Bruce W. Powe, will read from his latest book, *Mystic Trudeau*, at the Whitchurch-Stouffville Public Library Jan. 16.

"One of our finest cultural commentators" is the way Philip Marchand described Mr. Powe in a Dec. 23 Toronto Star article.

Mr. Powe is the author of many books on Canadian literature, politics and culture.

He was program coordinator for three significant cultural symposia at York University.

Mystic Trudeau, published by Thomas Allen Publishers, has been in stores since November.

Mr. Powe met with Pierre Elliott Trudeau a number of times since first seeing him at the Liberal leadership convention.

Mystic Trudeau chronicles some of the conver-

sations Mr. Powe had with Mr. Trudeau.

"I didn't know enough to ask him certain kinds of questions," he said. "I was very young then."

The book is an attempt to go back and ask those questions, Mr. Powe said.

There is no doubt Mr. Trudeau had a vision for Canada, Mr. Powe said, citing the concept of a just society, multiculturalism and multilingualism.

The author explores the myths and images of Trudeau that are now ingrained in the Canadian psyche, such as the time he made a full pirouette behind Queen Elizabeth or was photographed on a northern lake paddling his canoe solidly onwards.

Mr. Powe will read from 7:30 to 8:30 p.m. Admission is free.

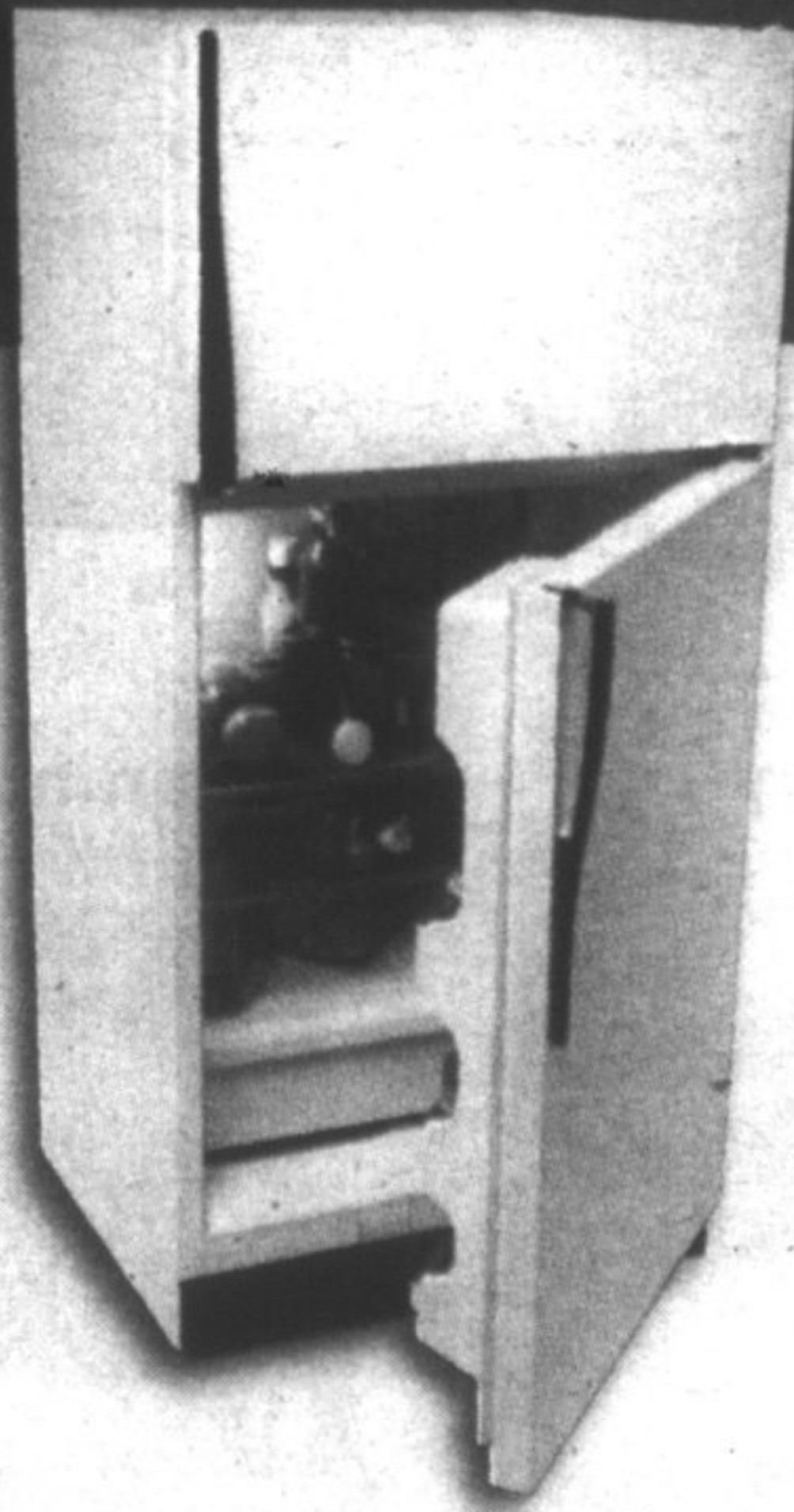
New Disposal Fee

York Region

A CFC removal fee of \$20 per unit will be charged at York Region's metal appliance drop-off depots, effective January 2, 2008.

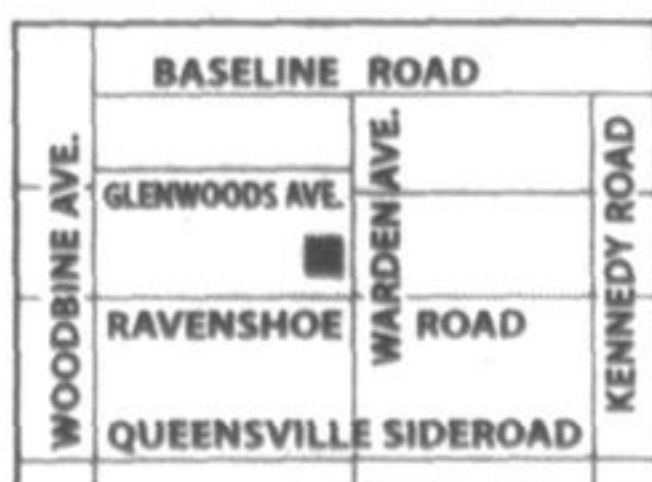
Appliances containing CFC refrigerants, such as refrigerators, air conditioners and freezers must have the CFCs removed before disposal.

York Region will continue to accept metal appliances without CFCs or displaying an approved CFC removal sticker, free of charge.

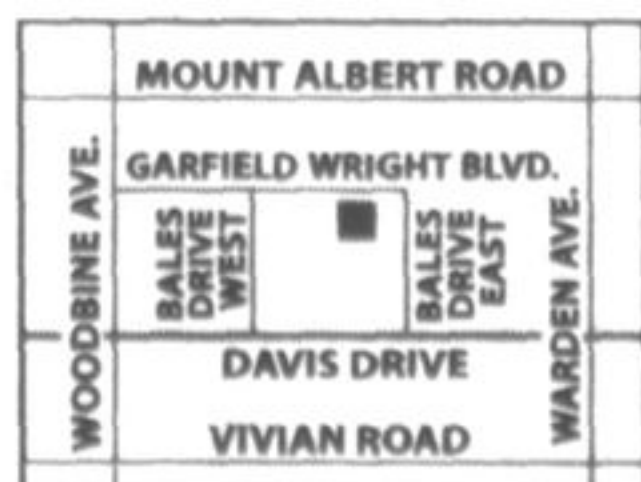
