

PREQUALIFICATION OF GENERAL CONTRACTORS, ELECTRICAL CONTRACTORS, AND MECHANICAL CONTRACTORS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLS FOR THE YORK REGION DISTRICT SCHOOL BOARD 2008-2010

The York Region District School Board is seeking contractor pre-qualification submissions for the construction of elementary and secondary schools within the York Region.

Contractors are requested to submit proposals for construction services in the following categories:

 New Elementary Schools General Contractor (minimum project value \$8M) Mechanical Contractor (minimum project value \$1.3M) Electrical Contractor (minimum project value \$700,000)

2. New Secondary Schools General Contractor (minimum project value \$22M) Mechanical Contractor (minimum project value \$4M) Electrical Contractor (minimum project value \$1.8M)

Only firms who have completed similar work of value suitable to each category will be considered.

General Contractors, Mechanical Contractors and Electrical Contractors interested in being qualified to bid the work MUST submit the following:

- 1. Completed CCDC Document No.11 Form 1996 Edition;
- 2. Resumes of management within the organization with educational institutional or similar experiences that would be assigned to the various projects;
- 3. Letter from a nationally recognized surety company stating total bonding limit and current bonding committed; and confirming availability of required bonding for any project, i.e. 50% Performance Bond and Labour and Materials Payment
- 4. Letter authorizing the York Region District School Board to obtain financial information from institutions on the applicant;
- 5. Indication from the proponent of any pending litigation or dispute involving the pre-qualifying firm;
- 6. Detailed description of the contractor's Health and Safety Policy and written confirmation that all Health and Safety policies and practices are followed at all times while on a construction site. Provide a copy of your Health and Safety polices and procedures manual;
- 7. Submission of most recent Forms CAD7 Calculations and CAD7-Profiles issued by the WSIB and Construction Safety Association:
- 8. Current Certificate of Insurance, minimum 3rd party liability of \$2M;
- 9. Bidders' certification that neither the bidder nor any proposed subcontractor is located in a jurisdiction that would place the York Region District School Board in contravention of the "Fairness Is A Two Way Street" Act;
- 10. Demonstration of ability to plan and maintain schedule. Submit a sample of a current or previous schedule with the prequalification submission.
- 11. References from previously completed and/or presently under construction educational intuitions or similar projects such as community centres, health centres, hospitals, clinics, stadiums, schools, etc., including contact names, positions, telephone numbers and addresses, in excess of the related value of the category of your submission; and
- 12. Description of the contractor's management techniques that would be applied to complete work of an educational institution. The prequalification process will include an assessment of previous performance in a number of areas, including but not limited to, similar work, scheduling, project management including construction completed in phases, workmanship, final completion, correction of deficiencies, change orders, and Health and Safety.

Pre-qualification submissions shall be submitted to the Education Centre - Newmarket, Facilities Management Centre, York Region District School Board, 1260 Gorham Street, Newmarket, Ontario L3Y 8W4 no later than 4:00 pm, Friday February 1, 2008. Envelope shall be labeled "General Contractor" or "Mechanical Contractor" or Electrical Contractor" Prequalification Submission 2006 -2008, to the attention of D.J. Snelgrove, P.Eng.,

Superintendent of Plant Services. Submissions can be dropped off Monday to Friday, anytime between the hours of 8:30 am - 4:00 pm. Responses received beyond the deadline or received at another location of the Board will be returned unopened. Last week, a man who is believed to have robbed the Main Street PACE Savings and Credit Union branch in June and December 2006 allegedly walked into the bank again.

Staff members recognized the robber when he arrived, police said.

He approached another teller and handed her a note demanding money.

The teller handed the note back, telling the suspect her till was not accessible and that she had activated the panic alarm.

He threatened "to jump over the counter" but fled through a rear door, police said.

"This guy from PACE, three different robberies, three not-great photos but decent photos and we haven't been able to catch him and that's just frustrating and you'd think that's one advantage we would have when he have his face out," Det.-Sgt. Wassink said.

On Saturday, at about 7:30 p.m., the manager of the Giant Tiger was closing the Main Street store for the day when an SUV, possibly a Hyundai Sante Fe, pulled up beside him.

Two men, one packing a handgun, got out and forced him to re-open the store before tying him up. The robbers grabbed cash and cigarettes, got back in the SUV and drove off, police said.

The manager was not hurt.

"With the Giant Tiger, we're checking with our counterparts," Det.-Sgt. Wassink said. "Why would they pick out the Giant Tiger, Stouffville as opposed to if there is a location in Markham? I don't know. Perhaps they just feel comfortable with that area."
