Region wants to partner on new fire, EMS station

Whitchurch-Stouffville's new fire hall should be a fire and emergency services headquarters when it opens by the fall of next year.

A staff report to York Region's health and emergency medical services committee recommends the region partner with the town to construct a building for the headquarters.

The new site would be on a large parcel of municipally owned land on Weldon Road behind Sobeys, moving the headquarters from its current location on Main Street.

The town plans to demolish the current building once a new facility is completed, the report says.

Construction is expected to begin on a 1,900-square-foot facility this summer and it's expected to open by the fall of 2009.



How is your town doing?

Town wants to get lead out

More volunteers are needed for the lead sampling program about to start in Whitchurch-Stouffville.

All Ontario municipalities now have to test for lead in the drinking water supply.

Sixty homes are needed from the community of Stouffville, while another 40 are needed from the Ballantrae/Musselman's Lake area.

Owners will have their water tested twice a year.

The first set of samples is being taken between Jan. 21 and April 15 and the

second set from June 15 and Oct. 15.

The town would like to particularly test the drinking water in homes that have a lead service line or lead plumbing. The second priority is being given to homes built before 1991, when plumbing could have been installed with pipe joining solder that contains lead.

Third priority will be given to newer homes.

When it comes to the municipal infrastructure, all known lead service lines from municipal water mains to homes have been replaced.

The Friends of Musselman's Lake is encouraging people to attend the public meeting regarding the proposed zoning change at the municipal offices Tuesday at 7 p.m.


Currently, there is the variety store and a vacant pizza parlour on the ground floor of the building. There are three one-bedroom apartments above the stores and a basement apartment.
