Kenyan crisis gets Stouffville aid

The crisis in Kenya is getting attention from Whitchurch-Stouffville.

Stouffville Road-based cbm Canada, formerly Christian Blind Mission International, through its staff and regional office in Nairobi, is providing emergency assistance to the African nation's political humanitarian crisis.

At least 600 people have died and around 500,000 people are homeless due to riots, ethnic killings and widespread violence following a disputed Dec. 27 presidential election.

people's livelihood.

"People with disabilities are often those who suffer the most as they are unable to flee from danger or find food when it is in short supply. They suffer greatly from the longer-term economic repercussions of civil unrest."

Following the emergency response, the mission plans to provide long-term support to assist people who are blind, deaf or physically impaired and their families, who are at risk of hunger and illness.

The mission, which supports more than 34 partner projects in Kenya, has been working there for more than 30 years.
