

Last-second shot in O.T. has Spartan boys in basketball semis

The Stouffville District Secondary School Spartans senior boys' basketball team was forced to put in a little overtime Friday for its York Region Athletic Association tier two quarter-final game against St. Jean de Brebeuf Catholic High School (Thornhill).

Fortunately for the Spartans the extra time paid off in a 64-63 victory and advanced them to today's semifinal.

With 1.2 seconds remaining in regulation time, Se. Jean de Brebeuf

tied the game to force overtime.

In the extra session, the Spartans came out strong and led by six points before St. Jean de Brebeuf rallied to take a one-point lead with nine seconds remaining.

After a St. Jean de Brebeuf player committed a foul, John Reesor went to the free throw line for the Spartans and missed his attempt. But Adam Prokop got the rebound and gave it to Kenny Czerwinski, who sank the game-winning basket with .5 seconds remaining.

Reesor led the Spartans with 16 points while Tyler Kiatipis added 13, Prokop 12 and Czerwinski, 11.

The Spartans face Unionville High School in today's semifinal at Keswick High School.
