## Youth get ticketed for good behaviour

Hey, kid, you're going to get a ticket for that.

York Regional Police, along with the Herbert H. Carnegie Future Aces Foundation, officially launched a "positive ticket" program this week.

It's designed to recognize young people spotted demonstrating positive behaviour and good decisionmaking skills.

Printed on the back of each ticket, which include certificates for McDonald's, Mac's Convenience Stores and Reptilia reptile haven, are the tenets of the Future Aces philosophy.

The program, piloted in Whitchurch-Stouffville in September, was launched at Brownridge Public School in Vaughan on Thurs-

The foundation's vision is to see all police forces follow the York force's lead, according to Bernie Carnegie, the Herbert H. Carnegie Future Aces Foundation's

executive director.

The involvement of York police in youth mentoring has yielded a significant drop in street crime traditionally committed by young people, Chief Armand La Barge

"Success is achieved not only by the police, but by our community partners as well," Chief La Barge

said in a statement.

"York Regional Police stands with the Herbert H. Carnegie Future Aces Foundation in their efforts to assist today's youth."


