# Winners, Kelsey's, banks in Nofrills development

A larger Nofrills could be open within a year west of Tim Hortons on Main Street.

It will be one of several big-box-style stores on land formerly owned by Don Anderson Haulage Ltd.

The widening and reconstruction of Main Street in the west end to four lanes will restart in March.

Construction could start on the grocery store this summer, said Tom Parry, Whitchurch-Stouffville's director of development services.

Construction of other outlets, including Winners, Royal Bank, Scotiabank and Kelsey's, could also start soon.

There had been some site prepara-

tion on the 30-acre parcel. But little has happened lately as Anderson Haulage awaited completion of its new headquarters in Gormley,

Anderson's current building can then be demolished, paving the way for the new development. That is anticipated to happen this spring.

The 30 acres was made up of three properties, the centre one owned by Anderson Haulage. The property was bought by the Rice Commercial Group, also headquartered in Gormley, about three years ago.

The first phase of development will be the Nofrills store of more than 40,000 square feet, with provision to add another 18,500.

Access to the stores will be from a road leading out to Main Street with traffic lights.

Residential development will go in along the east side of the property abutting the existing neighbourhood.




