Motus O, a dance theatre company based in Stouffville, performs Petrouchka Tuesday as part of the Whitchurch-Stouffville Public Library's March break program.

Petrouchka, created by Igor Stravinsky, tells the story of a wizard and his three marionettes: the strongman, the ballerina and the unlikely hero, Petrouchka the clown. During the show, which incorporates

theatre, music and dance, Petrouchka outwits the strongman, tames a bear, juggles bowling balls and saves a life.

In the early 1900s, about 40 or 50 dancers would perform Petrouchka. In the Motus O version, said Jack Langenhuizen, a co-founder of the company, there are four.

The dancers in Tuesday's per-

formance are Mr. Langenhuizen, James Croker, a co-founder of Motus O, Laura Day and Kate Cunningham. The costumes were designed by the company's other founder, Cindy Croker.

The performance is in Latcham Hall at 10:15 a.m.

Later this month, Motus O will bring Carmina Burana to the stage at Wilfrid Laurier University, perform at community theatres across Saskatchewan and perform and hold workshops in North Bay.
