Brothers charged in lottery fraud

Two brothers, one a Whitchurch-Stouffville resident, have been charged with fraud after an Ontario Provincial Police probe into a lottery claim.

On Feb. 7, the 43-year-old Stouffville man arrived at the Ontario Lottery and Gaming Corporation's Toronto prize office claiming to be the owner of a winning Pro Line ticket, validated and verified to be a winner.

During the validation process to ensure the man was the lawful owner of the ticket, lottery staff became suspicious when he wasn't able to give them enough information about where the ticket was purchased and police were called, according to the OPP.

police investigation revealed the man's brother,

a 42-year-old Toronto man was the legitimate owner of the ticket but he had asked the Stouffville man to claim the prize.

While the Toronto man knew his brother was claiming the prize on his behalf,

the probe determined the Stouffville man did so for a fraudulent purpose, the OPP

Both men are charged with fraud under \$5,000.


