## Waste plant would produce pellets

It is a conclusion "we don't agree with," Mr. Bricker said.

At Tuesday's council meeting, he said the Ministry of Municipal Affairs & Housing has "taken an excessively conservative decision on this".

His next step is to enter into talks with the province with the intent of bringing back new information for council to consider.

Mayor Wayne Emmerson noted that if the proposal is environmentally safe and sound and of benefit to the community, it should be looked at again.

The company is proposing a plant

that would cover around eight to 10 acres, including the yards for trucks and other uses.

It would receive biosolids, such as sludge from municipal waste water treatment plants and other organics. A closed loop system would be used to dry the biosolids into a dry, loose compound that can be mixed with compost for garden mulch or formed into pellets which can be used for fuel.

From 1962 to 1983, Waste Management and the previous owner operated a landfill operation on about 86 acres of the property. The dump site was closed in 1983. It is monitored regularly and annual reports are submitted to the Ministry of the Environment.




