Council salaries, expenses filed

The amount earned by Whitchurch-Stouffville's mayor, councillors and committee members in 2007 was presented to council Tuesday afternoon.

Making these numbers public is required by both the Municipal Act and provincial legislation.

Last year, Mayor Wayne Emmerson's salary was \$35,000, his car allowance came to \$7,000 and other expenses were \$4,606 for a total of \$46,606.

As the municipality's representative on York Region council, Mr. Emmerson received \$44,191 in salary from the region in 2007 as well as \$1,596 in expenses.

Each councillor, Ken Ferdinands, Phil Bannon, Clyde Smith, Susanne Hilton, Richard Bartley and Rob Hargrave, each received a \$23,000 salary. The car allowance for each councillor was \$2,500.

Councillors' other expenses ranged from a high of \$2,190 for Mr. Ferdinands to a low of \$905 for Mrs. Hilton.

The three members of the committee of


