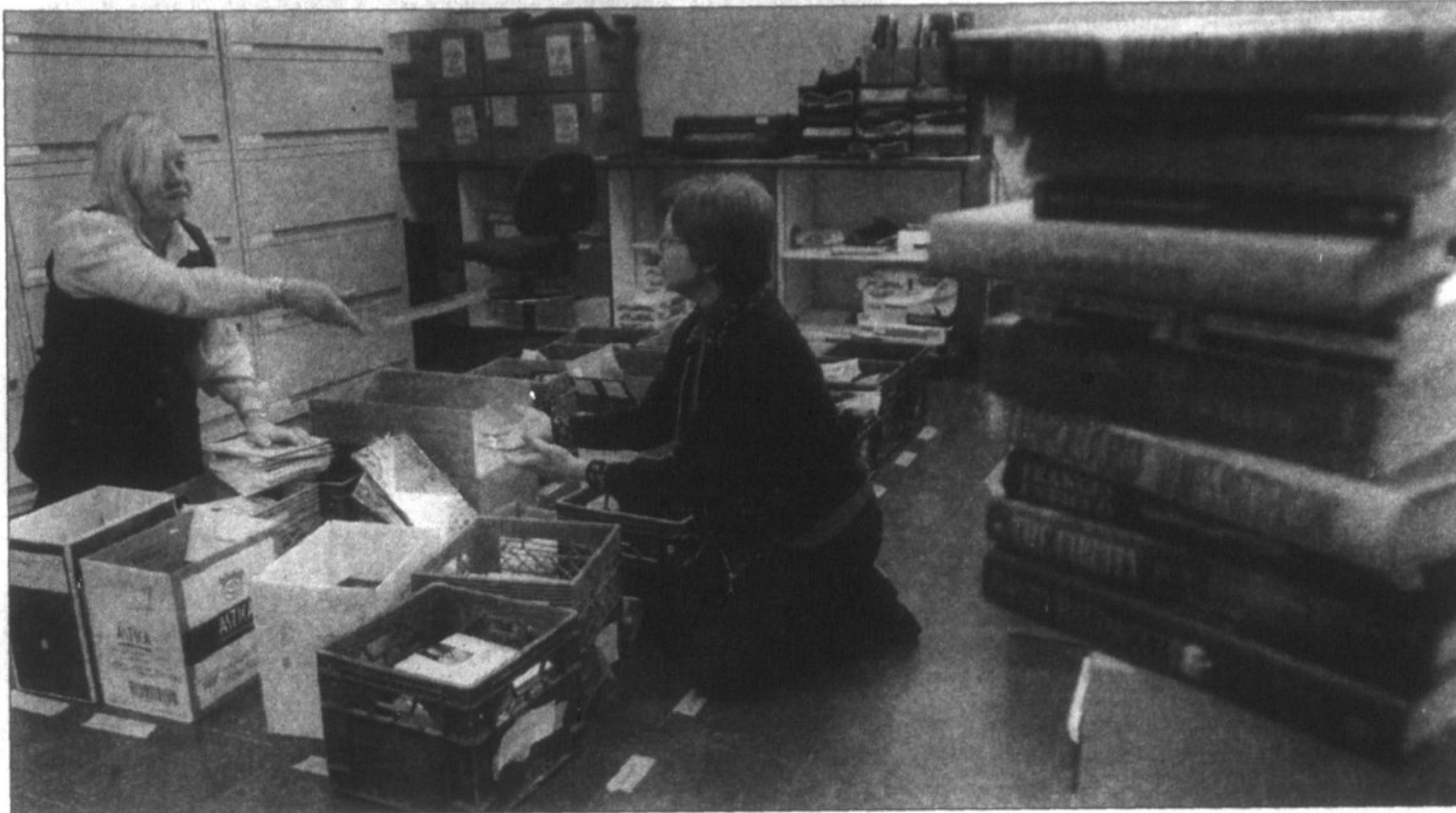

Record crop of used books good news for library

Stouffville's ultimate 're-use it' event is just around the corner.

More books than ever have been donated to the Whitchurch-Stouffville Public Library's annual giant book sale, which runs from April 2 to 6.

Book lovers can start heading down to the sale April 2 from 6 to 7:30 p.m. April 3, there's a seniors' hour for those 60 and older from 9 to 10 a.m. The sale continues on April 3 and 4 from

10 a.m. to 8 p.m. On April 5, the book sale runs from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. and from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. on the last day, April 6.

Volunteer power is crucial to the book sale's success. About 100 residents come out to help before, during and after the event.

They include the Stouffville Kinsmen, Stouffville Lions and members of the Richardson Masonic Lodge.

The volunteer firefighters with Whitchurch-Stouffville Fire and Emergency Services as well as more than 20 high school students also pitch in.

Books for the sale are accepted all year long.

The sale raised more than \$12,000 last year, a total which library CEO Carolyn Nordheimer would like to see surpassed this year.

All proceeds from the sale go to purchasing more books, to enhance programming, and to support the summer reading program.

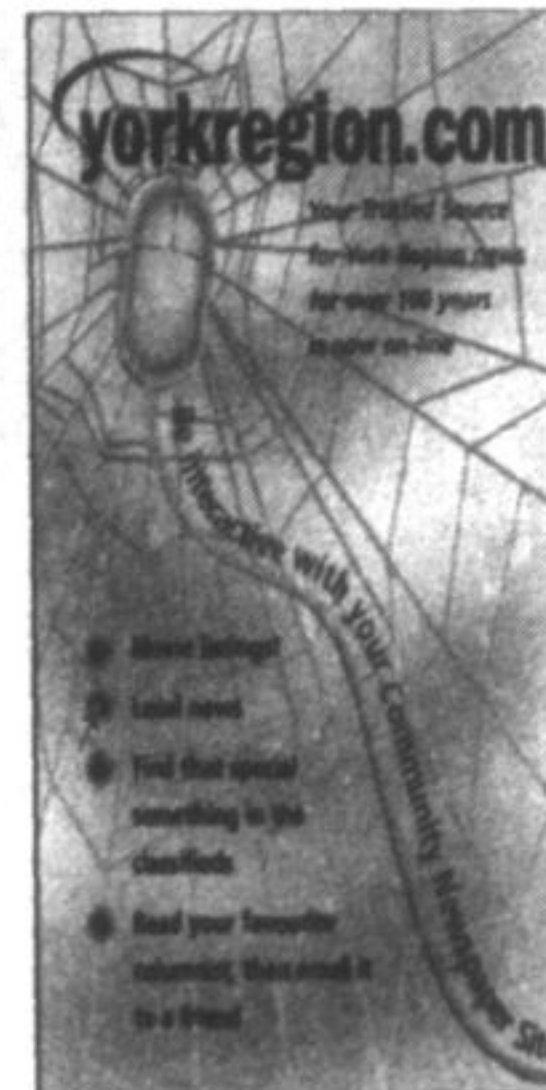

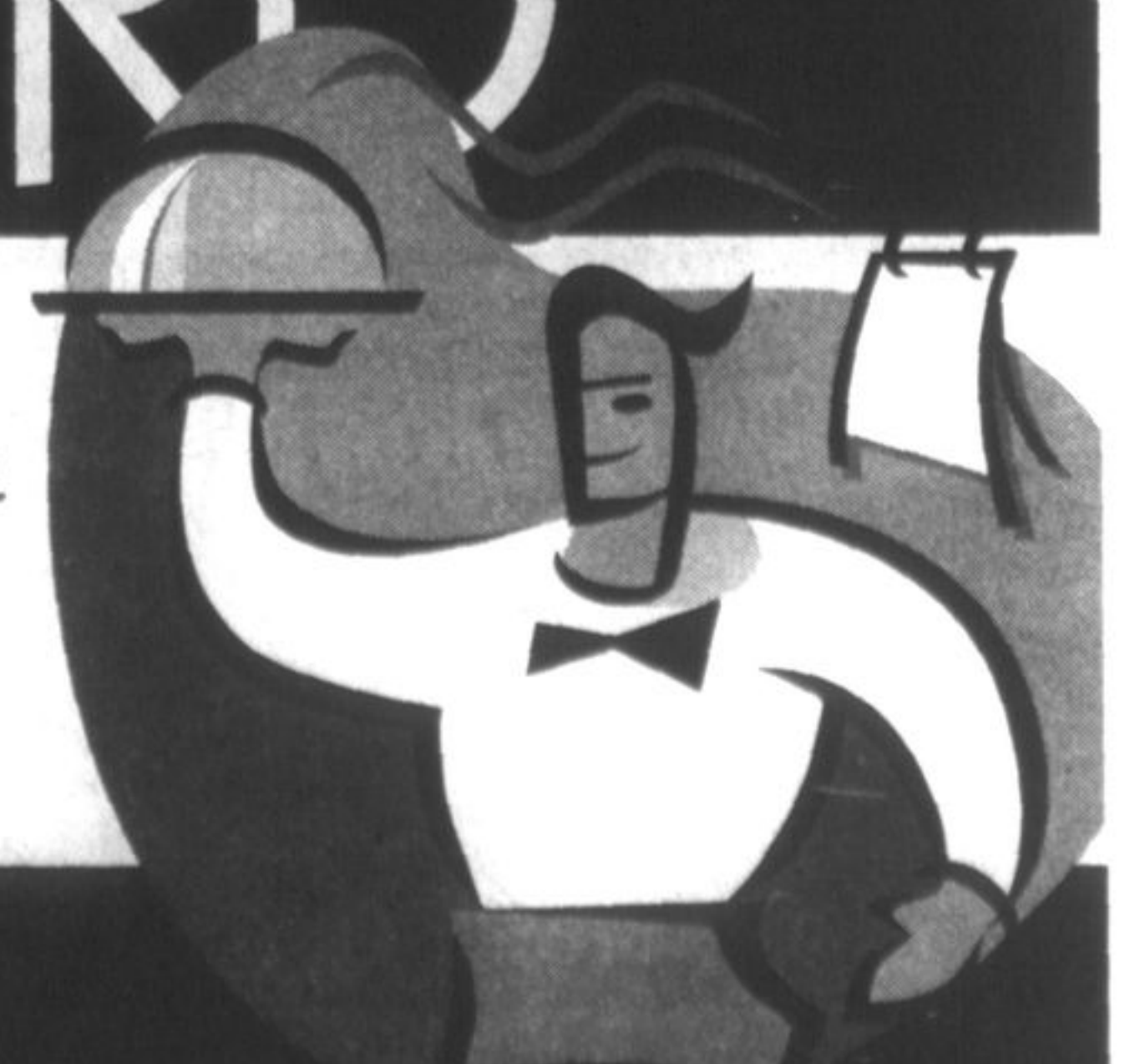
