

Reesor powers Virginia college into conference tourney

A Stouffville resident has played an integral role in helping the Eastern Mennonite University men's team during the North East Collegiate Volleyball Association Western Division Cross-Over Tournament.

Curtis Reesor, a sophomore member of the Royals squad, had four kills in the third game and three in the fourth that helped his team post a 3-1 (25-30, 30-26, 30-22, 30-26) victory over Medaille College Friday in Yoder Arena.

The six-foot-tall Reesor plays the outside hitter or opposite hitter position for the Royals, who improved their record to 14-10

this season.

Fellow Stouffville District Secondary School grad Justin Reesor also plays for the Harrisonburg, Va., school.

EMU plays tomorrow in the opening round of its conference tournament. The division three school has enrollment of 1,600.

Vincec settles for second place, named top rookie in race series

Mike Vincec concluded the Skip Barbour Southern Region racing series on a positive note by winning the final race at Sebring, Fla. Sunday, claiming second place in the overall standings and garnering top rookie honours.

The 16-year-old Stouffville resident and Sunoco Team Ultra 94 team driver began Saturday's second-to-last race by claiming the pole for the Championship class in a record time of 1:14.494 for the new track layout.

The race, however, did not unfold as planned. Vincec made contact on the final lap that sent him off course and dropped him into ninth place.

Starting from ninth in Sunday's final race, Vincec manoeuvred towards the front and by the 13th lap, led the pack.

He prevailed at the finish line to take the checkered flag by .034 seconds.

"That was a lot of fun," Vincec said. "It is really great to have battled for the win. That's what racing is all about. Going for broke and doing everything you need to do to come out on top."
