The Stouffville Country Market is celebrating its new look with a grand opening Saturday.

Mayor Wayne Emmerson will officially re-open the market, which first opened in Stouffville in 1952, at 10:30 a.m.

It was closed Jan. 28 to March 15 for renovations.

It has received a tremendous response from many new residents, long-time market owner Norm Clements, said.

People of many different backgrounds come to buy chickens and other small livestock, he said.

Market vendors are feeling a new

sense of excitement because all the booths are taken inside the market building and there are many outside vendors.

Previously, the building had a lot of empty vendor spaces.

"We are pretty encouraged," Mr. Clements said.

"In the last few weeks, there seems to be a new wave of interest."

Market hours are from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Fridays. On Saturdays, the hours are 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. and Sundays from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Livestock is being sold Saturdays only from 5 a.m. to 11 a.m.
