

Peewee AEs end season with a trophy

The Stouffville peewee AE Clippers finished their season on a high last weekend by going undefeated and capturing the East Gwillimbury Spring Fling Tournament in Sharon.

They capped off the minor hockey tourney with a 2-1 win over Newmarket in the final.

Trailing 1-0 entering the final period, the Clippers tied the game just 30 seconds in on a power-play goal from Curtis Davis.

About two minutes later, the Clippers took the lead on Davis' second goal of the game.

Connor Allen and Matt Renzoni earned assists on Davis' first goal.

Helping to preserve the Clippers' win was some solid netminding from Austin Porter.

In reaching the final, the Clippers blanked East Gwillimbury 2-0 in their opening game. Riley Sulman and Renzoni scored within a 38-second span in the opening period. Alex McKean posted the shutout.

Facing the Fort Erie Junior Meteors in their second outing, the Clippers received a solid netminding effort from Porter and a goal by Renzoni with just 1:45 remaining in regulation time to post a 1-0 win.

With a berth in the final on the line, the Clippers got timely goals from John Anthony Coscarella and Doran to skate off with a 3-1 win over the Innisfil Winterhawks.

Renzoni scored the first goal for the Clippers.

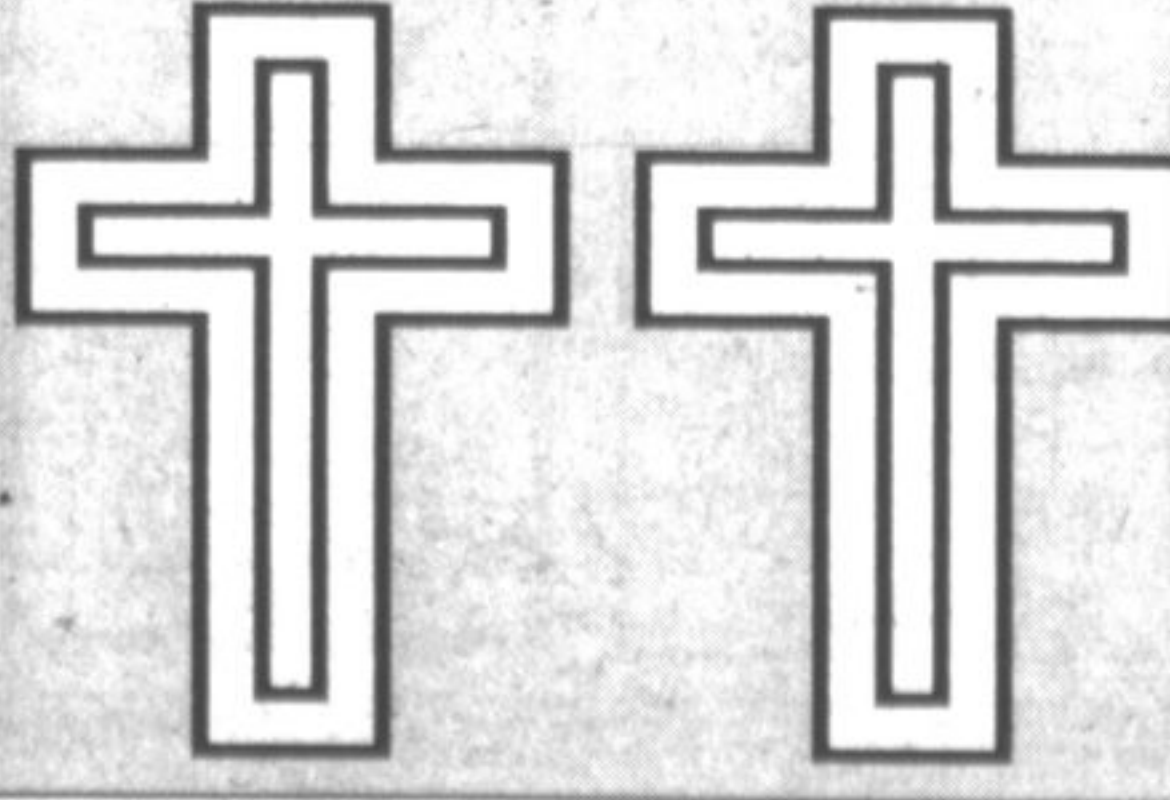
