

# MULTI-LEVEL GOLD SKATERS STARRING IN STOUFFVILLE CLUB'S 44TH ICE SHOW

Two local skaters will shine at this year's ice show.

Brittany said this time around, she's a little nervous being of the last performances of the show.

and Carley are confident this show will be the best yet.

"It's going to be a really good show," Carley said. "I think it'll be more fun for us too."

"(The show) is geared toward all ages and there's a lot of extras," Brittany said, adding she and fellow skaters will sport hair pieces.
