

Arty Party, programming cuts tied to gallery shortfall

Mark your calendars for the May 10 Arty Party, the Latcham Gallery's major fundraising bash of the year.

The event takes place at the Cedar Beach Pavilion beginning at 7 p.m.

A jazz trio will entertain and there will be silent and live auctions, with items such as golf for four at the Sleepy Hollow Golf Club, original art and tickets to performances at Stratford and the Shaw Festival.

Auction items and services are still being sought.

The gallery is trying to make up a shortfall of about \$20,000 in its budget with the fundraiser, through member donations, encouraging members to hold their own gallery fundraisers and increasing corporate and individual donations.

The gallery is also focusing on

finding ways to increase its revenue.

Financial constraints mean some cuts have had to be made to the gallery's adult programming, while its popular children's and young people's programming will be increased.


This is the second year the gal-

lery has received \$50,000 in yearly operating funds as part of the town's leisure services budget.

Visitors also get an insight into what might worry a child growing up in a rural setting in the early days and what she looks forward to for the future.
