

Elizabeth Taylor, Prince Philip made noise for soundman

So you think we seniors are passé?

Take a look at 85-year-old Nolan Roberts, still volunteering at Care & Share Shoppe on Main Street in Stouffville.

Nolan was born in 1922, in Liverpool, England, in Penny Lane (yes, the Beatles' Penny Lane).

He volunteered in the Royal Navy during the Second World War and served on an aircraft carrier. After the war, he worked with Pathe News as a recording engineer in England, Nigeria, South Africa and Egypt.

Nolan met famous people recording sound in news, documentaries and movies.

sound at LeMans 24-hour car race and was in the Jaguar pit when there was a terrible crash into the crowd killing many people.

On the Royal Yacht Britannia, Philip (who would later marry Queen Elizabeth) managed to trip over Nolan's cable and reamed him out over it.

Nolan was in one of the first research planes doing maneuvres, attempting to break the sound barrier.

He was recording the sound, enabling engineers to hear any pitch changes in the engine that would require modifications to the wings of the plane.

From England, Nolan took a brief contract with Canada's National Film Board for three months, but ended up staying five months.

Back in England, studios were

closing and a Toronto film company, Film House, urged him to come work in Toronto.


He, his wife and three sons immigrated to Canada.

Today, two sons live in Toronto

while the other moved to Scotland. Nolan's wife, Stella, died eight

years ago.

In true British restraint, Nolan says, "Canada is a pretty reasonable sort of place to live."
