Firefighters hope to see more alarms this year

How is your smoke alarm, Whitchurch-Stouffville?

You may find a firefighter at your door asking that question.

Whitchurch-Stouffville fire and emergency services has started its annual smoke alarm program with the assistance of local businesses.

And its hoping for better results than in 2007.

In 2006, legislation was passed requiring working smoke alarms on every level of your home and outside all

sleeping areas.

Last year, just 57 per cent of houses entered by fire crews here were in compliance.

"That was alarming," fire prevention officer Jeff Bignell said. Failure to maintain or install smoke

alarms can result in a \$235 fine. "Fire crews are going door-to-door

to ensure working smoke alarms are installed on every level and near sleeping areas," Mr. Bignell said. "If a smoke alarm is not correctly installed or missing, fire crews will install a new battery operated alarm free of charge."

They plan to visit 800 homes this

year with the focus on neighbourhoods built before 1986.

Schell Lumber and Stouffville Canadian Tire have donated smoke alarms. Sandy MacKenzie, of State Farm Insurance, has provided fire and life safety literature that will be distributed to residents.

The three businesses have been nominated for the Ontario Fire Marshal's public fire safety council awards.
