that raised \$300,000 last fall, naming rights, the town's voluntary assistance agreement, development charges and park trust funds.

Mayor Wayne Emmerson said last fall he was surprised by the lack of interest in the project from the entertainment community.

Mr. French hopes that changes June 25.

While inviting downtown merchants, he has been encouraged by the response, including proposals to rent the building or offer spin-off business to events.

Concerts, recitals, trade shows, receptions, art shows and parties have all


been suggested.

"With the price of gas, people aren't going to be traveling as much," said Mr. French, who expects residents to look for hometown activity more than before.

The redevelopment of the centre and adjoining Civic Square and Memorial Park, all a few metres from his home, are exciting.

The Celebration of the Arts talent competition marked a turning point in Daniel Panetta's life.
