A Stouffville youth walked for a good cause, and a personal one, last weekend.

Jules Bartle, 12, participated in the Walk to Cure Diabetes Sunday at the Canadian National Exhibition grounds in Toronto. He was diagnosed with Type 1 Diabetes in April 2007.

Jules rallied family and friends together to create his 29-member unit called Team Power.

Jules, the captain, and his team raised about \$8,000 for diabetes research, with Jules raising \$1,250 alone.

He and his team both surpassed their fundraising goals of \$1,000 and \$5,500 respectively.


