McLeod also booted the convert on Kuettel's try.

Spartans head coach Tom Mintchev conceded the Tigers were the better team on the day.

"Uxbridge was well coached and very physical. It was tough for our boys. We were outmuscled physically. We lost the physical battles.

"But to reach the final was a good accomplishment. To finish second in the province is fantastic. The boys can't hang their heads."

To reach the final, the Spartans defeated Oakville Trafalgar Secondary School 10-7 earlier in the day.

The Spartans juniors reached the semi-finals of the Barbarian Cup before they were eliminated 19-7 by Trenton High School Monday.

Spartans head coach Jamie Hewitt felt the game rested on two factors.

"Defence," he said. "And mistakes. We made a couple in the first half that were costly.

Hewitt was also quick to give credit to Trenton, whom he said played solid defence.

"We lost only two games all year and we won the York Region title and the Red Hot, so it was a good year," Hewitt said.
