Did you know?... The Barn...

... was originally located in Wexford (Scarborough)

... was dismantled and moved to the Gilroy farm in Whitchurch in 1957

... in September 1983, was dismantled, relocated and re-built by Museum volunteers in an old-fashioned barn-raising at the museum

... framework was constructed in one day, followed by a homemade feast and dance

... is three-quarters of its original size

... had no floor until 1989
