Stouffville kids win Ontario school judo titles

Three members of the Stouffville-based Sheffield Judo Club earned first-place finishes while another finished second at last weekend's Ontario School Championships in Mississauga.

Jaya Creavalle, a 15-year-old brown belt, was first in her category in the +63 kg juvenile girls division.

Tressa Sheffield, a 13-year-old blue belt, won the -44 kg juvenile girls' title.

Jordan Creavalle, a 19-year-old first degree black belt, won the -73 kg IJF junior boys' grouping.

Marcus Chan, a 12-year-old green belt, placed second in the -42 kg juvenile boys' division.

The four students also qualified to represent Ontario at the Canadian School Championships in Mississauga July 5 to 6.

Also competing for the Sheffield club were Sean Long and Dylan Morrison in the 9 to 10 year old boys' division.

Squirts consoled with B crown

The Stouffville Storm squirts boys fastball squad came home from last weekend's Cobourg Tournament by winning the B side final with a 10-2 win over Cobourg.

Trailing 2-1 in the fourth inning, the Storm got key hits from Patrick Henri, Hunter Davidson and Patrick Fiorino and erupted for four runs to take a 5-2 lead en route to the consolation title.

Henri, Davidson and Fiorino each went perfect at the plate while Kerrick Brown, Nathan Cho and Cameron Flemming each contributed one hit.

The Storm also got a big defensive play from outfielder Tyler Krabi, who made a running catch in right field to prevent any runs from scoring.

Ryan Jones tossed six innings and allowed just four hits while striking out eight batters to earn the win.

The Storm opened the tournament on a positive note with an 11-2 win over Stone Mills.

Davidson had two hits, including a home run, and Luke Simcoe also collected two. Jones, Flemming, Fiorino and Tommy Boyle also had one hit.

Brown tossed four innings and struck out seven batters to earn the win.

Facing Napanee in their second game, the Storm suffered a 7-4 loss and were relegated to the B final.

Jones and Simcoe each had two hits for the Storm. Other hits came from the bats of Flemming, Fiorino, Boyle, Brown, Matt Avoledo and Davidson.

Jones went four innings and gave up seven runs and eight hits to take the loss.

Despite not making the A final, Storm coach Ross Jones saw good things.

"We have evolved from a team that had three strong hitters at the start of the year to all 11 players contributing at the plate. When the top of the batting order could not hit, the middle and end of the batting order rose to the challenge and pounded the opposing pitcher. With our strong pitching and solid defense we were a strong team but now adding solid hitting, we are capable of beating anyone in Ontario," he said.

Bad luck at Mosport for Gibbons

Peter Gibbons was in the running to take the checkered flag at Sunday's NASCAR Canadian Tire Series Dickies 200 race on the Mosport International Raceway 2.459-mile road course near Bowmanville.

But the weather and an untimely accident put a damper on the 45-year-old Stouffville-area resident's hopes.

Starting in the fourth position, Gibbons held the lead with his Canadian Tire/Mobil Super Chevy from laps seven to 22 and from 30 to 51.

But near the 44th lap, rain began. While a number of drivers stopped to change tires to combat the elements, Gibbons stayed on the course.

The move appeared to pay off until an accident involving Ron Beauchamp Jr. on the first turn of the 51st lap put a delay on the proceedings.

During the re-start, Gibbons was passed by several drivers and ended the event in ninth place.

Gibbons is in second place in the points race, 42 points behind leader Scott Steckly through two races.

The Stouffville-based Team 3 Red entry's Snap-on Tools Dodge driven by Jason Hathaway finished 13th after starting the race in the 12th position.

The third race in the series goes June 28 at Barrie Speedway.
