MAIN STREET IMPROVEMENTS UPDATE

Construction on Main Street continues this month between Mostar Street and Winona Street, west of the Ninth Line, and east of Highway 48 where a culvert extension is being built. Please take care when traveling through the construction areas where lane restrictions may be encountered.

You may have noticed that new traffic signals have been constructed at the Ringwood Drive intersection. Baker Hill Boulevard to the north now connects to Millard Street, which will serve as a good alternate route from Highway 48 to the Ninth Line. You may also consider Hoover Park Drive as an alternate route on the south side of town.

Over the next few weeks construction of the storm sewer will continue, together with the related manholes, catchbasins and other stormwater collection appurtenances, and traffic will remain diverted to the temporary lanes.



Are you odd? ... or even?

As of May 19th, all of York Region's municipalities are under a Water Conservation Notice, meaning that residents must follow local outdoor water-use bylaws until September 2nd.

Odd house numbers may use water outdoors only on odd numbered days of the month and even house numbers may use water outdoors only on even numbered days of the month.

- Outdoor water use is allowed between 6:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m.
- One-month grace period for new sod and seed

What about Water Bans?

Should hot, dry weather deplete our water supply levels and hamper our ability to handle emergencies (i.e. fighting fires), the Region — or parts of the Region — will be under a Water Ban with no outdoor watering permitted.
