Golden boys of SDSS had winning habit

To be a part of one Ontario Federation of School Athletic Associations championship team during high school is a big deal.

To be a part of two provincial gold-medal winning clubs is something else.

Four Grade 12 Stouffville District Secondary School students were on four OFSAA team title clubs during the last 16 months.

Matt Raguseo, Joe Beare, Jamie Gregory and Chris Boake were members of the Spartans' OFSAA AA gold-medal winning hockey clubs in 2007 and 2008. They were also teammates on the OFSAA AA gold-medal rugby clubs during the same years.

"If someone had told me that I would be a part of four OFSAA gold medal teams I wouldn't have believed them. It was totally unreal," Beare said.

"It was pretty awesome," Gregory said. "You hear of people winning at OFSAA and they might get a bronze medal and hearing they had to work hard to get that. But to get gold four times ..."

"When I first came into high school I dreamed of going to OFSAA at least once," Boake said. "But I never thought of winning four OFSAA titles, let alone two. It was truly amazing."

Raguseo, who was also named the school's senior boys athlete of the year for the second consecutive time, thought he hit the jackpot after winning his first provincial crown with the hockey team last year.

To win four titles though, was unbelievable, he said.

"When we won our first OFSAA title it was like 'wow'," he said of when they won last year's hockey crown. "None of us expected to win four. You just have to live the moment."

Good fortune, good teammates and having good coaches including Jamie Hewitt, who ran the hockey and rugby programs, were keys.

"We certainly didn't have too many injuries," Beare said. "But having a good coaching staff was the key."

"Sure, luck was important," Raguseo said. "But we worked hard and we were a determined group."

"Stouffville athletes are known to play hard and never give up," Boake said. "We played every game like it was our last one."

Even though each championship was specia, a rugby crown that ended with a gut-wrenching 19-17 overtime victory over the Adam Scott Collegiate and Vocational Institute Lions (Peterborough), was the most memorable of the four.

They acknowledged there was some pressure exerted on them to win that elusive crown.

Especially since Boake suffered an untimely hip flexor injury in their final pool play match and was on crutches for the remainder of the tournament.

Replacing Boake, who manned the allimportant scrum half position, was Greg-

"It certainly was hard to watch," Boake recalled. "I kept jumping around on the sidelines.

"I was definitely nervous," said Gregory,

who scored the eventual game-winning try. "The game was intense. But I thought I played the best game of my life."

Defending the titles was harder.

"Last year, we weren't seeded when we were at the OFSAA hockey. But this year was different because we were No. 1. The teams were out to get us this year and each game was tough. You almost had a target on your back," Gregory said.

The fousome will not be together when school resumes in September.

Gregory will study engineering at the University of Western Ontario. Beare will take police foundations at Seneca College. Boake will working during the first semester and return to SDSS for the second semester and possibly rejoin the rugby team.

Raguseo intends to return to SDSS next year.


