

# Mennos extend win streak to four

The Stouffville Mennos extended their winning streak to four games with a 5-4 verdict over the Newmarket Stingers in Oshawa City and District Fastball League action Thursday in Memorial Park.

After the Stingers scored a pair of runs in the fourth inning to take a 2-0 lead, the Mennos tied the score during the bottom half on a two-run single by Kristian Burkholder.

The tie was short lived as the Stingers scored twice in the fifth inning.

But the Mennos responded with three runs in the fifth. Shortstop Jeff Boadway belted a two-run double. Advancing to third on an error, he scored what would be the game-winning run when pitcher Jay Nesbitt hit into a fielder's choice.

The Stingers had an opportunity to tie the game in the seventh when they had a base runner on third with one out, but Nesbitt bore down and induced one batter to ground out and recorded the final out on a fly ball to end the game.

Scott Eyre, Burkholder and Curtis Reesor had two hits for the Mennos.

Byron Baranieski pitched the first four innings for the Mennos before giving way to Greg Dalgarno, who went two innings to pick up the win. Nesbitt earned the save after throwing a scoreless inning of one-hit ball.

Chris Boyd went the distance for the Stingers and gave up eight hits and five runs to take the loss.

The win by the Mennos came on the

heels of a 7-4 road win Tuesday against Lake Simcoe.

In that game, Nesbitt almost took matters into his own hands after collecting two hits that included a second-inning home run, driving in three runs and pitching five innings of one-run, five-hit ball.

The Mennos broke the game open in the third inning when they erupted for six runs. Dale Boadway, Eyre, Baranieski, Nesbitt and Brett Boyd had singles during the uprising. Helping the Mennos' cause was wildness on the part of Lake Simcoe hurler Greg Garrity and a dropped fly ball in the outfield.

Now 10-4 on the season, the Mennos are scheduled to play in Oshawa Tuesday against the BB Juniors.

## Mites win third tourney title

The Stouffville Storm mite fastball team fielded its third tournament gold medal in as many appearances this season by defeating Walkerton 8-6 in the final of last weekend's Stratford tourney.

The Storm jumped out to a 3-0 lead in the third inning on a run-scoring single by Ryan Dunlop and a two-run double by Ben Welsh.

The Storm padded their lead in the fourth inning when Jake Stevens singled and Cole Gunathunge drew a walk. Both runners scored on a double by Daniel Wynn to give the Storm a 5-0 lead.

Walkerton erupted with six runs in

the top of the fifth to take a 6-5 lead.

But in the final inning, Dunlop had a leadoff single while Kevin Matthews and Welsh drew walks to load the bases.

Brody Krabi cleared the bases with a double to give the Storm an 8-6 win.

Matthews struck out 10 batters in going the distance to earn the win.

To reach the final, the Storm won their first game over host Stratford 6-4.

Trailing 4-0 after a half inning, the Storm mounted a comeback in the third inning when timely hits from Maverick Dent and Dunlop keyed a three-run rally to put Stouffville to within a run.

In the final inning, Welsh smashed a lead-off home run to tie the game. Krabi then drew a walk and Josh Eizenga was hit by a pitch. Sean O'Neill then hit a double to cash in the winning run.

Facing St. George in their second game, the Storm were forced into extra innings before emerging with a 4-3 win.

Trailing 2-1 after one inning, the Storm tied the game in the third inning when Matthews singled home Dunlop.

The game remained tied into extra innings when hits by Dominik Hykel, Dunlop and Jackson Savery translated into two runs and the win.

Matthews went the distance, striking out 16, for the win and a berth in the final.

The Stouffville Storm squirts also took part in the tournament and downed Paris 11-0 before losing to Port Perry 8-1 and Kitchener 4-2.
