It's a great way for families to spend an afternoon said Brian O'Sullivan, one of the organizers.


"It's free and people don't have to pay for parking," he said. "It's wonderful Stouffville provides things like this."

Two masked men, one carrying a handgun, robbed a gas bar in Whitchurch-Stouffville Monday.

They took money and cigarettes from the Sunoco station at Stouffville Road and Woodbine Avenue in Gormley before fleeing on foot at 2 a.m.

The attendant in the store was not injured.

Both robbers are between fivefeet, 10-inches and six-feet tall.

One is black with a muscular build.

He was wearing a black T-shirt, black jeans, black baseball hat and a black bandanna over his face

The other robber is black and wore a white T-shirt, dark blue jeans, black tuque and a blue and white bandanna over his face.
