It's the first summer camp of its kind in Canada of which organizer Corey McCusker knows. Another session, that's all but at capacity, begins Aug. 18.

Ms McCusker started Muttz with Mannerz obedience training after leaving the corporate world two years ago. The Stouffville resident does group and individual training.

She wanted to create something for children and their pets. The summer camp was born.

"It's such a special bond," she said.

Many of the participants have taken lessons already. And the "man's best friend" saying applies in spades here.
