

# Food, music cooking at inaugural Cornstock

It's time to open your ears, in more ways than one.

The inaugural Cornstock festival is taking place Aug. 9 in Whitchurch-Stouffville, boasting of good food and quality music.

"It's a music festival for anyone and everyone," said Allan Reesor-McDowell, one of the organizers. "We're going to have lots of good food for everyone."

The event runs from 10 a.m. until 10 p.m. at Willowgrove, 11737 McCowan Rd, just south of Stouffville Road.

At least 14 acts will perform, including Blank Blue Skye, Bryan Moyer Suderman, Joel Kroeker and Crush Luther.

Besides the wide variety of music, ranging from folk to punk rock to reggae, an assortment of ethnic food will also be served. The menu includes homemade ice cream and Canadian, Chinese, Salvadorian, Colombian and Mediterranean favourites.

And corn, too, of course.

Ticket buyers can swim from noon to 6 p.m. in the pool on site, provided they bring their own bathing suit and towel.

You can bring basketballs, baseball equipment and Frisbees to take part in games.

The festival is being organized by Mennonite Central Committee (MCC) Ontario, a relief development and peace organization. MCC is partnering with Willowgrove and ODE Productions to

put the festival on.

MCC's objectives include sending assistance to communities recovering from wars and natural disasters, encouraging and supporting local churches in their quest to provide food, health care and education to community members and educating people on how to create peace in their communities.

"MCC does a variety of things," Mr. Reesor-McDowell said. "The programs range from refugee resettlement to working internationally, development work, food and security projects."

The festival is aimed not only at those connected with the Mennonite church, but the entire community.

"We want this to be a welcoming event for anyone in the community," he said. "We're (also) trying to find ways of getting younger people involved in MCC.

The event will go on rain or shine. Participants are asked not to smoke,

drink, do drugs or bring pets. Tickets are \$15 in advance or \$20

1. Keep all children within arms' reach whenever they are in or near the water.

2. Don't drink and boat - water and alcohol don't

3. Always wear a lifejacket or PFD. It won't work if you're not wearing it.

4. Don't go it alone. Take a buddy when you swim, fish or boat.

5. Make sure where you're swimming is safe; check water and weather conditions before you swim.

6. Plan for emergencies. Be prepared, get trained, and know what to do if something goes wrong. 7. Get carded by taking a boating course and learning

how to safely handle your watercraft. 8. Buckle up preschool and non-swimmer children in a lifejacket or PFD, but remember, these are not

babysitters. See tip #1.

9. Learn to swim by taking lessons or earning your Swim to Survive!

10. Set rules and limits on when and where to swim or
