The Spirit will play their final two pre-season games against the Aurora Tigers starting Aug. 28 at the Stouffville Arena at 7:30 p.m.

The final game between the two clubs will take place in Aurora on Aug. 29 or Sept. 5,

which had yet to be determined as of press deadline.

Markham won the South Conference and South-East championship last season. Aurora won the North, defeating the Spirit in the conference final for the second straight season. The Oakville Blades won the 2008 league and Central Canadian championships.

The Spirit will play in the league's new Central Conference this year. The goal of the one-year project is to focus on player development for the Ontario Hockey League and university hockey in Canada and the United States.
