DOG TAGS

If you've moved to the Town or have a new dog in the past month (closing date of September 1 is acceptable), you are eligible for a free 2008 dog tag. The only requirement is that you leave the Town a cheque, post-dated for January 01, 2009 in the amount of \$25, which will cover the cost of your dog's 2009 tag. All residents who licensed their dog prior to October will be mailed a convenient 2009 licence renewal form and postage paid envelope in December.

Dog tags help to identify lost dogs effectively and reunite them with their family as quickly as possible. The purchase of a dog tag also helps to offset the cost of animal control services in the Town, encouraging responsible pet ownership.

Did you know?

In spite of our best efforts, there are still some common recycling errors to be corrected including:

ITEM	PROPER DISPOSAL	COMMENTS
Shredded Paper	Garbage	Small amounts may be placed in your Green Bin
Plastic Wrap/Film	Garbage	e.g. pop can/water bottle wrapping; must separate plastic from cardboard
Styrofoam	Garbage	e.g. meat trays, take out food containers
Newspaper Bags	Garbage	Most carriers are pleased to have these back
Plastic Grocery Bags	Garbage	Re-use your bags or, better yet, refuse them and use reusable bags whenever pos- sible! Many stores offer a bag recycling program.
Blister packaging	Garbage	e.g. rigid, formed plastic cov- ering items on cardboard or boxboard such as toys, bat- teries, makeup, toothbrushes
Cans/juice Containers	Blue Box. (See comments)	please do not flatten these items as they are mechani- cally sorted by shape/size
Glass jars with lids	Blue Box (See comments)	please keep lids separate from jars when placing in Blue Box

PUBLIC NOTICE

YARD WASTE/LEAF COLLECTION

Residents are advised that leaves will only be collected if they are in paper bags or reusable open top containers (excluding cardboard boxes) such as bushel baskets or garbage cans. Plastic bags will not be collected.

The Town does not pick up leaves raked, blown or piled along the roads.

Non-containerized or non-bagged leaves present a traffic and drainage hazard and residents are required to remove them.

Yard Waste should be placed curbside for collection by 7:00 am on the collection day.

Other materials accepted for collection include leaves, plants, fine brush, tree clippings and branches up to 100 mm (four inches) in diameter and tied in bundles of a maximum length of 1.2 metres (four feet) and weighing no more than 22 kgs (fifty pounds).

York Region residents who wish to drop off their yard waste may do so, free of charge, at:
