Life sentence in 2003 murder

Man, 20, found shot in Warden Ave. field

A 27-year-old Toronto man was sentenced to life in prison with no eligibility of parole for 25 years in the shooting death of a Toronto man in Whitchurch-Stouffville more than five years ago.

He was found guilty of firstdegree murder.

Delroy Leon McFarlane was sentenced by Mr. Justice Robert A.


Clark Friday in the death of Joshua Anthony Julien, 20.

On May 31, 2003, at about 7:20 a.m., Mr. Julien's body was found in a field on the southwest corner of St. John's Sideroad and Warden Avenue in Whitchurch-Stouffville.

A post-mortem exam June 1 determined the cause of death to be multiple gunshot wounds.

Mr. McFarlane was arrested following a four-month investigation by York Regional Police and the Missing Person Bureau.

He was arrested Oct. 8, 2003.


