

Cop hurt on Bloomington

Two York police officers were taken to hospital after their cruisers were rear-ended early Tuesday morning in similar, but unrelated, incidents.

Shortly after 6 a.m., a marked police car was travelling westbound on Bloomington Road between Woodbine and Warden avenues in Whitchurch-Stouffville when it was rear-ended by a pickup.

The force of the collision sent both the officer and driver of the pickup to hospital with non-life-threatening injuries and caused extensive damage to both vehicles.

The stretch of Bloomington was closed for several hours. Michael Patrick Barnes, 22, of Oshawa was charged with dangerous driving. He is to appear in court in Newmarket on Feb. 9.

In the other incident, a York officer was directing traffic around 1:40 a.m. after a water main broke in the Hwy. 7 and Saddlecreek Drive area in Markham.

A black Hyundai driving westbound on Hwy. 7 drove through several orange and black reflective barriers blocking off the road and rear-ended the parked cruiser, which had all of its emergency lights activated.

The officer in the cruiser was taken to hospital with minor injuries.

Wan-Ho Song, 49, of Vaughan faces impaired driving-related charges. He is scheduled to appear in court in Newmarket on Jan. 28.
