Slow down out there, road warriors

Emergency responders were kept busy Wednesday morning as the first heavy snowfall of 2009 slowed traffic in York Region to a snail's pace.

York Regional Police were called to more than two dozen crashes throughout the region, Const. Marina Orlovski said.

By 10:35 a.m., 32 traffic incidents, on highways that run through York Region, were reported to Ontario Provincial Police. However, no serious injuries were reported.

Most of the incidents, which took place in communities including Vaughan, Markham, Whitchurch-Stouffville and Georgina, involved vehicles sliding into ditches and two-vehicle collisions with minor damage.


"Motorists must adapt their driving behaviour, slow down and drive according to the road and weather conditions," OPP Chief Supt. Bill Grodzinski, the commander of the Highway Safety Division, said in a statement.

Speed and aggressive driving are the two major causes of crashes during the winter, according to the OPP.

Police offered the following tips:

- Slow down and drive to the weather and road conditions;
- Leave a greater space between you and the vehicle in front of you;
 - Clear all the snow from your vehicle;
 - Avoid unnecessary lane changes; and,
- Make sure your vehicle is in proper working condition including lights and wipers.




