The Spirit also received forward Shawn Poitras, 19, from the Blues. The six-foot, one-inch, 190-lb. Poitras began this season with the Toronto Junior Canadiens.

"He's a skilled left-shot forward who can play all three forward positions and he has lots of speed," Joslin said of Poitras, who sat out Thursday's game against the Red Wings in serving a onegame suspension.

Gomes and McCann are both 20 and in their final season of junior eligibility. The trades enabled them to go to teams that are contending in their respective divisions, Joslin said, acknowledging they will be missed.

"Both were good team guys, who worked hard and were always committed," he

Second-year defenceman Pat McEachen will serve as the new team captain.

The Spirit had one card remaining as of yesterday and were looking for a defenceman, Keith Pandovski, Spirit president of hockey operations, confirmed.
