### Keyboard wizard making encore performance

SDSS piano student opens concert series show Sunday

Pianist and organist Andrei Streliaev will be headlining his third Stouffville Music Evening Sunday.

"He can play anything," Pat Wild, a member of the evening's organizing committee said, noting Mr. Streliaev will be performing classical, contemporary and sacred pieces. "He gets every sound possible out of that organ."

Trevor Pogue, a Stouffville piano student, will also be performing Sunday night.

The Grade 12 student at Stouffville District Secondary School will be playing a variety of songs including a Beatles medley and pieces by Oscar Peterson, as well as gospel and classical numbers.

In January 2008, Mr. Streliaev made his first appearance at the monthly talent showcase, after which one member of the audience told Ms Wild: "the calibre of the concert was the calibre of anything he'd seen in Paris."

Mr. Streliaev returned in October when he performed a live score to the silent film version of Phantom of the Opera.

The Stouffville Music Evening began in March 2007, when some residents decided they wanted to showcase local talent.

"We just said: 'there's so much musical talent in town, why don't we showcase it," Ms Wild said. "We did it originally as an outreach to the community."



Since then, the monthly event, which is held at Stouffville United Church, but not affiliated with the church, has had soloists, choral groups, brass bands, gospel choirs and organists from Stouffville and the GTA perform.

So successful is the series that some groups are now starting to call the organizers requesting the opportunity to be put on the schedule.

"It's very exciting to think they're starting to call us now," Ms Wild said.

In the coming months, the Stouffville Music Evening will host Vocal Horizons (Feb. 22), Bach to Blues (March 29), Hannaford Youth Brass Band (April 26) and Dcat Chorus (May 31).
