Ice skating on a heart-shaped rink on Musselman's Lake is just one reason to come out to this year's Whitchurch-Stouffville Winter Carnival.

For the sixth year in a row, residents from all over the municipality are invited to celebrate the season by tobogganing, taking ATV rides across the lake, or a horse drawn wagon ride at neighbouring Shadow Lake.

The event takes place at Cedar Beach on Valentine's Day, Saturday, Feb. 14, from 1 to 4 p.m.

To help warm up the belly, the Ballantrae Scouts will be serving up hot dogs, hot chocolate "and the best beaver tails you're ever going to have," according to event creator, organizer and Whitchurch-Stouffville councillor Phil Bannon.

Indoor activities are also avail-

able and include choir performances by local schools, a K9 unit demonstration by York Region Police, games and "the best clown around", Doo Doo.

Mr. Bannon originated the winter carnival after being elected to his first term of office six years ago.

"It's only natural for a community of this size to have a winter carnival; we have the best natural setting at Cedar Beach," Mr. Bannon said.

The first year for the event, about 500 people from the immediate community came out for ATV and hay rides. Last year, more than 2,000 people from Whitchurch-Stouffville and neighbouring municipalities ventured out for an afternoon of family fun.

"It's really turned into a great Stouffville community event," Mr. Bannon said.

Cedar Beach is at the corner of Ninth Line and Cedarvale Boulevard on the north side of the lake, about 10 minutes north of Stouffville.
